Over 40 Years of Service to the Southern California Diving Communities

The USC Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber, located on the campus of the USC Wrigley Marine Science Center at Big Fisherman Cove at the West End of Catalina Island, has been serving Southern California Divers since 1974 as an emergency medical facility for the treatment of scuba diving accidents. Without proper treatment, major problems from diving accidents, most commonly Decompression Sickness (the "Bends") and Air Embolism, can lead to permanent disabling injuries and in some instances be fatal. In the Southern California area around Catalina Island, the combination of effective on-site management of a diving accident along with the rapid response by Los Angeles County Baywatch Lifeguards, or the U.S. Coast Guard, and swift, effective treatment at the Chamber can save a diver's life.

#### catalina chamber

The USC Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber places a great emphasis on education. Programs taught by the Chamber at the Wrigley Marine Science Center, and on the mainland, include Emergency Dive Accident Management (EDAM) Emergency Response Diver (ERD), and Hyperbaric Chamber Operations. Professional, recreational, and research divers come from as far away as Antarctica to attend these courses. Chamber Tours and experiential Chamber "Dives" are available for groups and service organizations.

Diving is an amazingly safe sport . . . until it isn't. But we're all human and things happen. In fact, a

study has shown that 69% of diving accidents are caused by diver error. So the last thing you'd want to hear is, "Sorry, there's no chamber in the area so there's nothing we can do for you." Fortunately, that's NOT the case in SoCal. Since 1974, divers have relied on the USC Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber to bail us out when things go wrong. And once again, our Chamber is counting on you.

2019 marks our Chamber's 45th year of unbending service to the Southern California diving community. While our Chamber still gets about half of its funding from L.A. County, Chamber Day & Eve have become the major source of funds to keep our Chamber available to us 24/7/365. And that's why we need you to participate in Chamber Day & Eve 2019 on Wednesday, May 1.

This is our 31st annual Chamber Day event. The first one in 1989 attracted about 200 divers and netted about \$15,000 for our Chamber. Over the years the event has grown to over 1,000 participants by adding Chamber Eve, the Flying Dutchman, and the Chamber Challenge. Last year we raised just over \$117,000 for our Chamber. We are justifiably considered the largest single-day scuba charity event in the United States and perhaps even the world.

It's important to know that ALL monies raised go to the Chamber. No administrative fees are deducted from the proceeds, the participating SoCal boats donate their time and services, the manufacturers donate gear for raffle prizes, the Aquarium of the Pacific donates their facility for Chamber Eve (we still have to pay for the food), hundreds of volunteers donate their time, and you (hopefully) donate your money.

Here's how you get involved:

Chamber Day - Two dives at Catalina and a walking tour of the Chamber facilities including meeting rescue personnel from various first-responder agencies.

The Flying Dutchman - For those who can't do the daytime dive. (IMPORTANT NOTE - IT IS NOT A REAL BOAT, AND YOU'RE NOT REALLY GOING ANYWHERE.).

The Chamber Challenge - Direct donations which can also be in someone's memory.

Daytime Raffle - Valuable prizes, and you don't have to be present to win.

Chamber Evening - Sit-down dinner at the Aquarium of the Pacific.

V.G.D. (Very Generous Diver) Package - Limited (150 people) add-on to a Chamber Evening ticket that gets you early access, free parking, and

other goodies.

Mark your calendar for Wednesday, May 1, 2019, as that's the date for the 31st annual Chamber Day where SoCal's finest dive boats donate their services for the day to benefit our Chamber. The full roster of confirmed participating boats (in alphabetical order) are: Asante, Cee Ray, Giant Stride, Pacific Star, Sundiver, Sundiver II, Sundiver Express, and Westerly. (And for those who can't take the day off or don't dive, there's always the Flying Dutchman.)

Here's the way it works: Sign up for the boat you want to go on. We'll hold a reservation for you for 72 hours, but after that spots are guaranteed only when your donation is received. Note that we only have 172 confirmed spots available this year so don't get left behind. Your donation of \$110 (plus \$30 for boat food & air) is for a good cause: your Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber. Book early, because once a boat fills, it's unavailable.

Boats will leave their respective docks at 7AM and head for Catalina. (Some boats may allow you to board the night before and sleep on board.) You'll make two dives at Catalina and receive five daytime raffle tickets. To increase your chance of winning raffle prizes, you can purchase extra raffle tickets when you make your reservation or at the Chamber. (Please note you'll NOT be able to purchase extra tickets on the boats this year.)

At some point during the day, your boat will dock in Big Fisherman's Cove and everyone will disembark for a 75-minute tour of our Chamber facilities, including a chance for you to hear from first responders from L.A. County Lifeguards, rescue helicopter crews from the Coast Guard

and/or Sheriff's Department, and the Chamber crew will walk you around the Chamber itself. You'll even go inside and be pressurized to a depth of 1 foot. (Hard to believe, but you'll have to clear your ears.)

Most of the boats will arrive back at their docks by 5:30PM. (Some of the faster, smaller boats will be back earlier.) We try to contact all the boats to tell them who their raffle winners are. All the raffle prizes will be available in front of the Aquarium of the Pacific in Long Beach from 4:30-7PM at our drive-up raffle prize pick-up table.

Please remember that Chamber Day is a fundraising event and not a normal dive day charter. Due to the logistical issues involved, if weather conditions preclude the dive boats from safely going out on Chamber Day there will not be a make-up day. If weather forces us to cancel you will be transferred to the Flying Dutchman, and you will be given an additional 10 daytime raffle tickets.

The bottom line in all of this is that your continued support of our Chamber, in whatever form that takes, is essential for our Chamber to remain available and on-watch 24/7/365. And that means we need you to sign up for Chamber Day 2019 by calling a sponsoring shop or club, by calling our main number at 310-652-4990, or by going to our secure server. Come alone or bring a buddy, but don't miss this special event!

Especially for those who can't take a Wednesday off from work . . .

The Aquarium of the Pacific in Long Beach and the Chamber Day Committee once again invite you to join us for an evening of fish, food, and fun. Chamber Eve 2019 is Wednesday, May 1, from 7:00 - 10:30PM. Because the Aquarium realizes the vital role our Chamber plays in the overall safety of the SoCal dive community, and because they realize what a valuable contribution the roughly 150 volunteer divers make to the smooth running of the Aquarium, they waive their normal facility fee for this event and host it for us at no charge. (We still pay for the food but that's outside of the Aquarium's control.)

Our ticket price is again \$120 per person. (Folks who do the daytime and evening events will receive an extra \$20 in general day and eve raffle tickets as a bonus for doing both.) With attendance capped around 400, the earlier you sign up, the better.

Each table seats 10 for the sit-down, waiter-served dinner. Many of the tables are sponsored by area dive shops, clubs, and organizations. You can choose to sit with a group you know, or choose an "Open" tables and make some new friends. You can sign up directly with a table sponsor, through our secure server, or by calling us at 310-652-4990. Just be sure you let us know where you want to sit.

The doors open at 7PM. You'll have over an hour to explore the Aquarium exhibits, check out the prizes, deposit your raffle tickets, make purchases at our merchandise table, drink, and

mingle. Dinner will start a little after 8PM and our program gets underway after 9PM with remarks, raffle prizes, some stills and videos from the day, and a check presentation at the end. We usually wrap up around 10:15PM. It's always a fun evening for everyone, so bring along your dive buddy or even a non-diving friend or Significant Other.

From 7-9PM, we'll have our Blind Bid Auction where you can bid (but can't see what others have bid) on the highly-coveted Dive Immersion for Two at the Aquarium of the Pacific. So make your best offer and keep your fingers crossed. Winning bid will be announced during the evening.

When you buy your Chamber Evening dinner ticket, you'll also get five evening general raffle tickets and one Grand Prize ticket. There will be opportunities to buy more general raffle tickets when you get to the Aquarium. Total value of the evening raffle will be roughly \$10,000 and prizes will include regulators, BCs, computers, and more.

Once again, we'll do "Pick-A-Prize" as we've done in the past, and we'll again do a "targeted" raffle. There will be a bin for prize #1, a bin for prize #2,a bin for prize #3, and a bin for prizes #4-20 (based on value). You can "target" whatever you like with as many of your tickets as you like. Throw them all in for a specific prize or split them up. It's up to you.

The ultimate prize - and the last thing we'll award during the evening - is the Grand Prize, which this year will have you spending nine amazing days in the Manado, Indonesia, area diving with Murex Dive Resort and Lembeh resort as part of the "Passport to Paradise" package.

Please note that again this year, the Grand Prize ticket is separate from the general raffle tickets. You will get one Grand Prize ticket with you Chamber Eve ticket. You can't buy more (levels the playing field).

However, if you also get the VGD (Very Generous Diver) package as an add-on to your Chamber Eve ticket, you'll receive two additional Grand Prize raffle ticket. And please note: You must be present to win.

All night, we'll have full access to the Aquarium and its 12,000+ critters, comprising over 500 species and representing three major regions of the Pacific. In case you didn't know, the Aquarium of the Pacific is the only aquarium that focuses exclusively on the Pacific Ocean. And it's the only Aquarium ever to breed a juvy Black Sea Bass which you can (and must) see in the Amber Forest exhibit, twenty feet to the right just beyond our prize table.

As with Chamber Day, Chamber Evening tickets can be purchased by calling 310-652-4990 or by going to our secure server. Indicate how many tickets you want, what table you'd like to sit at, what you want to eat, if you'd like to add the V.G.D. Package, and how you want to pay. It's as simple as that.


The options at Crescent Bay are numerous. To the South are reefs with large crevices, one of which leads over to neighboring Shaw's Cove. There are times when the surge in this passage is very strong so enter with care. On the North side is another reef which is a fun place to traverse. Beyond the reefs here lie Seal Rocks, a pair of rocky spires on which Sea Lions "haul out" to rest and sun themselves. Here you



may have the opportunity to cavort with these playful and graceful mammals. They love to dive, zoom right at yor face and pull up just at the last second, mouth open, blowing bubbles.

The fish life at Crescent includes Opaleye, Garibaldi (of course), Surfperch, and other usual suspects. Depths here range from 10 to 25 feet with vis in the 15 to 20 foot range.



How much do oceans add to world's oxygen? By EarthSky in EARTH | SCIENCE WIRE | June 8, 2015

Most of Earth's oxygen comes from tiny ocean plants – called phytoplankton – that live near the water's surface and drift with the currents.





Scientists agree that there's oxygen from ocean plants in every breath we take. Most of this oxygen comes from tiny ocean plants – called phytoplankton – that live near the water's surface and drift with the currents. Like all plants, they photosynthesize – that is, they use sunlight and carbon dioxide to make food. A byproduct of photosynthesis is oxygen.

Scientists believe that phytoplankton contribute between 50 to 85 percent of the oxygen in Earth's atmosphere. They aren't sure because it's a tough thing to calculate. In the lab, scientists can determine how much oxygen is produced by a single phytoplankton cell. The hard part is figuring out the total number of these microscopic plants throughout Earth's oceans. Phytoplankton wax and wane with the seasons. Phytoplankton blooms happen in spring when there's more available light and nutrients.

And the density of phytoplankton varies. They sometimes float just at the surface. At other times and places they can be a hundred meters – about 100 yards – thick.

By the way, by about 400 million years ago, scientists say, enough oxygen had accumulated in Earth's atmosphere for the evolution of air-breathing land animals. But free oxygen by itself wasn't enough.

Another form of oxygen was also essential: the build-up of a special kind of oxygen at the top of Earth's atmosphere. There, where three atoms of oxygen bonded together, ozone formed. This layer of ozone at the top of Earth's atmosphere shields land organisms from harmful ultraviolet radiation from the sun.

Bottom line: Tiny ocean plants called phytoplankton contribute 50 to 85 percent of the oxygen in Earth's atmosphere.
