IF YOU NORMALLY DIVE CHAMBER DAY

About the Tall Ship Pilgrim...

We are very sad to share this heartbreaking news

Today, we share news that hurts our hearts.

We are very sad to announce that the Pilgrim, our beloved tall ship vessel that has served as an inspiring real-world classroom to hundreds of thousands of students and visitors, keeled overnight in her slip on our dock, rendering her useful life over.

As part of our maintenance process, the Pilgrim, built in 1945, undergoes out-of-the water and underwater inspections. In 2016 she was hauled out for survey and repairs and in October 2019, we began a fund to support the haul out and repair scheduled to take place in January 2020. The haul out was postponed until June due to overload at the yard. Meanwhile, Ocean Institute maintained our certifications and the United States Coast Guard issued a Certificate of Inspection (COI) in December and again in February, allowing our dockside programs to continue. Unfortunately, the Pilgrim keeled on March 29th and is incapacitated beyond repair.

We are sad to bid farewell to this iconic vessel which has been such an important part of Ocean Institute's programs and to the children that they served.

Our staff was informed this morning and we all feel like we lost a dear friend, as I am sure many of you do.

As previously communicated, Ocean Institute has been dealt very difficult blows this month (SEE VIDEO HERE) and your stories, encouragement, and support keeps us going and lifts our spirits during this devastating time.



Dear fellow warm water dive trip participants, Greetings and hope this message finds everyone, family, and friends healthy, hopeful, and doing well.

First, I'd like to start by letting everyone know about some good alternatives regarding our scheduled trip to Little Cayman Beach Resort in November 2020. We cannot get a full refund of our initial deposit. Our original due date for trip balance payments was September, 2020. Current conditions limit our ability to book make flight arrangements and travel. I have been in touch with our travel agent and we agreed to the following:

- 1. I asked if it was possible to get a full refund for our deposits and was told at this time, it is not possible. I needed to ask to then negotiate some alternatives for us if the answer was no.
- 2. We will re-visit group travel plans in August 2020 and decide if we will continue with plans or possibly re-schedule our trip.
- 3. Our deposits would then carry over if we decide to re-schedule our trip. And this would even mean we could reschedule for up to a year!

I will continue to stay on top of changes for our trip. Stay healthy, hopeful, and know I am doing what I can to keep our trip as a positive future goal- be it this November or another agreed upon date!

I truly appreciate Sharkbait Dive Club and serving as your Warm Water Trip Coordinator. May the shared love for our oceans, passion for SCUBA diving, wonderful memories, friendships and future travel adventures ahead of us keep a happy thought in all our minds during this most difficult time. I look forward the hearing 'pool is open' and dive into more adventures with everyone.

City of Laguna Beach acts to close trailheads and beaches to slow the spread of COVID-19

The City of Laguna Beach continues to monitor the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic and take the appropriate actions to prevent its spread. Over the weekend, a number of people traveled to Laguna Beach to enjoy the nice weather and in the process crowded our beachfront parks and trails. This afternoon, the Laguna Beach City Council met in an emergency closed session to consider the actions necessary to protect the public and prevent the spread of the coronavirus.

The Council voted to direct City staff to take the actions necessary to close trail access to the County wilderness parks tomorrow morning. The Council further directed staff to close City beaches on Monday night unless the County of Orange or the State of California does so before that time. Finally, the Council also directed the City staff to ask the County of Orange to close its beaches within the City or to grant the City permission to do so. The City beach closures would also include closure of the adjacent parks including Main Beach, Heisler, and Treasure Island Parks.

Governor Newsom's stay at home order permits outdoor activity as long as a safe social distance of six feet is maintained from people who are not part of the same household. Although many of our citizens are self-regulating and practicing social distancing, the increased number of people gathering on Laguna Beach trails, beaches, and in adjacent parks creates more opportunities for community spread of the virus. These public parks contain benches, railings, and structures that are high-touch areas and could potentially be a source of spread of COVID-19. The Council determined that closing these areas is prudent to reduce the potential spread of the virus and protect the public.

These actions are in addition to the City Council's prior actions to close basketball, tennis, and volleyball courts, along with all children's playgrounds.

In order to enforce the closures, the Laguna Beach Police Department will increase monitoring. Citizens who do not comply with the closure orders will receive citations.

"The safety of the public is our utmost concern, and this decision was not taken lightly by the City Council. We were unanimous that these steps must be taken now in our City to slow the spread of COVID-19. I urge everyone to comply with our actions for the health of everyone in our community and beyond," said Laguna Beach Mayor Bob Whalen.
