




SharkBait Monthly Meeting

Jonathon Casey, Aquarium of the Pacific

Johnathan Casey is the curator of fish and invertebrates who manages the Aquarium's Shark Lagoon and the Southern California Gallery.

Jonathon has expertise in the conservation and culture of endangered white abalone, sea turtles, seagrass, and coral. Additionally he is skilled in ornamental aquaculture (rearing tropical fish popular amongst hobbyists), with a focus on finfish and sharks and rays. His expertise also includes species epidemiology, etiology, pathology, quarantine, and treatment. He enjoys working on creating exhibits, emphasizing authenticity to biotope (ecological community of a particular habitat).

Jonathon previously worked at various aquatic institutions in Hawaii. He received a B.Sc. in biology and minor in chemistry from George Fox University, studied marine biology at the University of Washington, and has been maintaining aquariums since he was five years old. He is an avid underwater photographer.

The October 27 Beach dive will be our pumpkin dive. The dive will be at Little Corona in Corona Del Mar (Newport Beach) The pumpkin dive will require you to take an UNCARVED pumpkin down with you. When on the bottom, you will carve your pumpkin, being careful not to injure yourself. Bring a bag with you to put the pumpkin in after it is carved, and a small weight as we will continue the dive, with the pumpkins. After the dive, the carved pumpkins will be judged for originality, beauty and art worthiness by a panel of international experts (we may have to substitute for the international experts as we are having trouble with visas and stuff). It will be a fun dive and a new experience for some of you.

Little Corona has a good supply of sightseeing and photo subject matter. On the reefs, in water 20 feet and deeper, small gorgonian sea fans, starfish, feather worms and assorted invertebrates can be found. Visibility is generally good. Water clarity on the outer reefs can reach 30 feet but is generally in the 15 to 20 feet range. The reefs start shallow and slope gradually to 30 feet 150 yards out. The reefs lie on either side of a sandy cove with the more interesting reefs to the south side. Little Corona is located in Corona Del Mar and is easily reached by turning toward the ocean from PCH onto Poppy Street. Poppy will end overlooking the ocean and turn into Ocean Blvd. the path to Little Corona is just left of this intersection. A paved path winds down to the beach. Restrooms and showers are located half way down the path.

Post 2024 Singapore and NAD Lembeh, Indonesia: Trip Recap

This was a combination of SCUBA diving and cultural discovery adventure! Five club members began the journey at LAX for a 17-hour and 50-minute direct plane ride to Singapore! One member continued from Singapore to Manado Airport, Indonesia (about 4 hours), followed by an hour-long transport to a dock and then a short ½ hour boat ride to arrive at a NAD Lembeh Resort. The remaining four explored Singapore for a few days to acclimate to the time zone difference of 15 hours ahead of California time. All of us arrived at our respective destinations with all our luggage. The adventures began.

Singapore has strict laws. There were a few researched items to consider. Such as, you cannot chew gum or even bring it into the country, drugs are forbidden, no jaywalking, no throwing trash, cutting people off in line, or being rude to elders. A few words to sum up Singapore would be clean, vibrant, steamy, and pricey. The food was great, the people were friendly, and the atmosphere was very much so alive with excitement since the 2024 Singapore Grand Prix was in town at the same time. Public transportation was a short walk from the hotel, and we purchased two-day passes and used the subway system well. The walking adventures were awesome. The humidity was very high, so a hat or umbrella was necessary. Nighttime was cooler, and the city really came to life since walking around was easier in a milder temperature with no sun.

We joined our other dive member at NAD Lembeh resort and the SCUBA diving portion of the trip ensued. The accommodations were excellent, and each room had great working A/C units. There were nice areas to lounge in; the food was served buffet style, and the staff accommodated dietary restrictions well with pre-made dishes for those who required them. I don't think anyone was hungry after each meal as plenty of food was available. A plastic crate was placed outside our rooms to place all our gear in (BCDs, fins, regulators, and anything else you wanted on the boat). Once on the boat each person had their crate under the seating area to place things and remained there for the duration of the trip. No lugging things back and forth. Of course, you can take a few things to rinse and camera gear off and on, which most of us did.

Sharkbait had its own boat the whole trip, with one other diver joining our group, who was an excellent photographer and had many stories to share! The guide-to-diver ratio spoiled us for future trips, whether one-on-one or one-to-two. It was very much SCUBA divers' spoiled dream operation for sure. The diving was easy with a back roll into the water and, when ending the dive, the option to remove the BCD and climb up the ladder. Water, snacks, and clean towels were provided on the boat in between dives for nice hour-long-plus diving intervals. Two dives in the morning, one in the afternoon, and night and blackwater diving were available if desired. The muck diving was superb. Our trip included a voyage out to Bangka, where it was a little bit longer of a boat ride of about 1 1/2 hours, and the dive site left the entire group in awe of an active and healthy coral reef. We saw many colorful sponges, anemones, critters, and even a turtle! The vibrant colors - amazing! When we were done diving, the gear was rinsed, hung for us, and returned dry to our rooms in a crate. This was the driest gear on a return trip home. Stay tuned for future dive club meetings, where you can see pictures and videos that tell a better story than words can.

On the way home, a direct flight from Singapore to LAX is 15 hours and 55 minutes long. Something about the tailwind makes it faster to get home. The flights were long, but the adventures will last forever.

Something funny always happens on club trips- and to end this write-up on a humorous note, the following is hilarious because it worked out well. Our boat ride from the island to the dock area was going well, and there was even a video of the boat ride, but then the engine died- remember, after the boat ride, is about an hour-long van ride to get to the airport for flight number one of two. Then, the on-the-spot repair was done, and we continued. This 10–15-minute delay seemed to last forever! The funny memory will last in our minds with laughter.
