April Speaker Mike Spranger

Mike Spranger is co-owner of Pacific Sea Farms, a 10 acre sugar kelp and oyster farm in the Salish Sea off Vashon Island (near Seattle).

He can speak to a variety of topics around seaweed farming including farm design, hatchery process, operations, permitting/lease requirements and the business side.

In addition to diving on the farm to maintain the infrastructure he is a volunteer diver for WA Reef Check and the Seattle Aquarium.

Mike has been a resident of Vashon Island for over 20 years. After working for 30 years at a fortune 500 company, he retired from corporate life to co-found Pacific Sea Farms with the intention of creating a business that allows him to support his local and global ecosystems and community. As an advisory member of the Washington Seaweed Collaborative, Mike is highly involved in bringing kelp farming to the Puget Sound Region. When not out on the water, Mike is working with government agencies and other potential kelp farmers to expand kelp farming throughout the region.

The Parrot Head Reef will be comprised of two sizes of reef balls, ranging in size from about 600 to 1,600 pounds (272kg to 726kg).

Los Angeles Wildfires Could Likely Be Affecting Ocean Life

The wildfires that have devastated parts of Los Angeles, California in the past weeks have resulted in ash and debris being scattered over the ocean surface as far as 160km/100 miles offshore, scientists have found.

Researchers from UC San Diego's Scripps Institution of Oceanography and NOAA Fisheries' Southwest Fisheries Science Center on the NOAA Ship Reuben Lasker and its crew began collecting samples of the ash from the deck and the surrounding waters.

April 13 Beach Dive Crescent Bay, Laguna Beach 7:00 AM


The options at Crescent Bay are numerous. To the South are reefs with large crevices, one of which leads over to neighboring Shaw's Cove. There are times when the surge in this passage is very strong so enter with care. On the North side is another reef which is a fun place to traverse. Beyond the reefs here lie Seal Rocks, a pair of rocky spires on which Sea Lions "haul out" to rest and sun themselves. Here you may have the opportunity to cavort with these playful and graceful mammals. They love to dive, zoom right at yor face and pull up just at the last second, mouth open, blowing bubbles.

The fish life at Crescent includes Opaleye, Garibaldi (of course), Surfperch, and other usual suspects. Depths here range from 10 to 25 feet with vis in the 15 to 20 foot range.

Access is off of Circle Way near Cliff Drive. You Have Two Options:

There is a stairway off Circle Way leading down to the Cove. Circle Way is a One Way Street - Access is about 2/3 the way around the Circle.

There is also an access way at the intersection of Circle Way & Cliff Drive



May 18 Beach Dive Woods Cove Laguna Beach 7:00 AM

Woods Cove is a fairly large cove divided in two by a large rock structure at the surf line. On the Northwest side of the cove about 50 yards out are two rocks that break the surface. These are huge boulders that extend 20 feet down surrounded by smaller rocks with abundant marine life. Out from the southern most reef is a small underwater arch with Garibaldi and a great picture taking spot. The reefs straight out beyond there are spectacular. Huge boulders with ledges and caves harbor a variety of marine life. The reef extends quite a way offshore offering additional sites to explore

The access point to Woods Cove is almost directly off PCH. Turn toward the beach on Diamond Street and park on Diamond or Ocean Way. The beach access is at the end of Diamond Street

Meet Your Sharkbait Board Members

So that was how it started. I went to Sport Chalet, signed up and a couple months later I was NAUI certified in 1997.. My daughter and I enjoyed many great dives together around Catalina and trips to Hawaii. Throughout that time we completed our PADI Advanced and Rescue certifications together.

She graduated and went into 80-100 hour weeks as an Intern and Resident so I was left

on my own and decided Divernaster would be a fun and rewarding continuation of my diving experience. That was completed in 2001.

I went to work for Sport Chalet as a Divemaster, mostly working on the dive charter boats and doing dive refreshers. I continued doing that and added the PADI SCUBA Experience when that was initiated. Alas, Sport Chalet went out of business in 2016 and so did I. Now I just dive for pleasure.

I have dived in Southern California waters around Catalina for the most part with occasional jaunts to San Clemente, Santa Barbara, Anacapa and Santa Cruz Islands. Internationally I have dived several of the islands in the Caribbean, Belize, Cozumel and Roatan (Honduras) as well as all of the Hawaiian Islands and The Philippines.

In addition to diving, I enjoy sailing. I have been sailing for about 25 years now both cruising the Southern California waters and racing. I also enjoy golfing,,,, pretty much a work in progress. Currently a 18 handicap with eyes on 14 before I die (pretty much assured of a long life with that as a criteria).

I have been a member of SharkBait Dive Club since 1998.and a member of the Board since 1999. I have been President (3 or 4 times, maybe more, I can't remember), Vice President (a few times). Currently I publish the Newsletter, keep track of the finances of the club and am club Secretary.

Our Chamber remained fully operational even through the pandemic, when many organizations had to cut expenses. But, like any business, our operating costs continue to rise.

For example, we now need solar-powered battery backup units for the volunteer quarters and main Chamber hangar, an unexpected \$10,000-\$15,000 expense.

This is why every dollar raised during this event is critical.

Los Angeles County provides about 40% of our funding, but the rest must be raised by us—the diving community. Chamber Day remains the largest single-day scuba charity event in the U.S., and with your support, 2025 will be another record-breaking year!

THE HISTORY OF CHAMBER DAY

The Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber opened on October 5, 1974, thanks to a Los Angeles County grant. Its first treatment took place a week later.

By the mid-1980s, however, the County's continued funding was in serious jeopardy. In 1988, when funding cuts seemed inevitable, Roger Hess, owner of Charisma Charters, proposed an idea:

What if all local dive boats came together for a single day to raise funds?

Thus, Chamber Day was born in June 1988, raising \$15,000 in its first year.

Since then, Chamber Day has grown tremendously:

1991 - Raffle added

1998 – Chamber Eve, the Flying Dutchman, and the Chamber Challenge introduced

2020 – First all-virtual Chamber Day (due to the pandemic)

2022 – Full in-person return (but Virtual Chamber Eve remains)

Financially, the event has also flourished:

1990s - Surpassed \$50,000

2006 - Broke \$100,000

2021 - Surpassed \$150,000

2024 - Nearly reached \$200,000
